LAST year Moora woman Pauline Carr ran the 14-kilometre HBF Run for a Reason and plans to do so again on May 22.

“The HBF run will provide me with a challenge and improved fitness, but it is the cancer fight that will really spur me on during those last kilometres,” she said.

“I have a couple of family members that are currently giving cancer a good fight.

“I know I’m not alone.

“It seems we all know someone who is or has been affected by cancer these days.

“I hope I get to see the day when we find the cancer cure.

“That will be a great day.”

Funds go directly to the Cancer Council WA and an online receipt will be produced making it tax deductible.

“To date I have raised \$560 with support mainly from Nixon Farming, the local hockey community, friends and family,” she said.

“Last year I only raised \$90 with donations from close family members, so this year I set the target of \$500.

“Having now passed that I have my eyes on the \$1000 mark.”

The 28-year-old has lived 25 kilometres south-east of Moora for the past four years with her partner Dave Bantock, who is a cropping manager for Nixon Farms.

The young couple has recently decided to make the Moora area its permanent home by buying a farm in Mogumber, 45 kilometres south of Moora.

Pauline is the regional manager for a gourmet food distributor called Centra Fine Foods based in Perth.

“I have worked for the company for seven years but in the past four years (after meeting Dave), I have travelled

“I play hockey for Robins in Moora and I’m sure my training is going to help me get ready for this year’s season.
